Spiritual Gift Definitions

Gift	Description
Administration	The ability to understand what makes an organization function, and the special ability to plan and execute procedures that accomplish the goals of the ministry.
Craftsmanship	The ability to creatively design and/or construct items to be used for ministry.
Communication	The ability to communicate God's truth through a variety of art forms.
Encouragement	The ability to present truth so as to strengthen, comfort, or urge to action those who are discouraged or wavering in their faith.
Faith	The ability to act on God's promises with confidence and unwavering belief in God's ability to fulfill his purposes.

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Giving	The ability to contribute money and resources to the work of the Lord with cheerfulness and liberality.
Helps	The ability to accomplish practical and necessary tasks which free up, support, and meet the needs of others.
Hospitality	The ability to care for people by providing fellowship, food, and shelter.
Intercession	The ability to consistently pray on behalf of and for others, seeing frequent and specific results.
Leadership	The ability to cast vision, motivate, and direct people to harmoniously accomplish the purposes of God.
Mercy	The ability to cheerfully and practically help those who are suffering or in need, having compassion that is moved to action.
Apostleship	The ability to start and oversee the development of new churches or ministry structures.
Prophecy	The ability to reveal truth and proclaim it in a timely and relevant manner for understanding, correction, repentance, or edification. There may be immediate or future implications.
Evangelism	The ability to effectively communicate the gospel to unbelievers so they respond in faith and move toward discipleship.
Shepherding	The ability to nurture, care for, and guide people toward ongoing spiritual maturity and becoming like Christ.
Teaching	The ability to understand, clearly explain, and apply the Word of God, causing greater Christlikeness in the lives of listeners.
Discernment	The ability to distinguish between truth and error. It is able to discern the spirits, differentiating between good and evil, right and wrong.
Knowledge	The ability to bring truth to the body through a revelation or biblical insight.
Wisdom	The ability to effectively apply spiritual truth to meet a need in a specific situation.
*Healing	The ability to be God's means for restoring people to wholeness.
*Interpretation	The ability to make known to the body of Christ the message of one who is speaking in tongues.
*Miracles	The ability to authenticate the ministry and message of God through supernatural interventions which glorify him.
*Tongues	The ability to receive a spontaneous message from God in public worship and to speak it in an unknown language that is then made known to the church through the gift of interpretation.

SECTION 1: Physical Labor Ministries

Section 1 consists of activities of a physical nature, such as activities that involve working with plants or animals. Sample servant opportunities: helping with church's landscaping; mission trips that include physical labor, etc.

	<i>Assemble/Construct:</i> Build machines, furniture, buildings, etc., using mechanical, construction, or carpentry skills
	<i>Drive/Fly:</i> Maneuver a car, truck, plane, etc (could include high speed or emergency situations)
	<i>Enforce compliance:</i> Request, demand, or force people to obey rules, laws, policies, etc.
	<i>Handle emergency situations:</i> Take appropriate action in situations related to fires, accidents, etc.
	<i>Install:</i> Place machinery, devices, etc., in position for service or use
	<i>Landscape:</i> Develop a plan for modifying an outdoor area using trees, plants grass, etc.
	<i>Move with agility:</i> Partial or whole-body movement using coordination, strength or endurance
	<i>Operate equipment:</i> Use manual dexterity or physical movement to run tools or other machinery
	<i>Patrol:</i> Watch over and guard areas or people to maintain orderliness and safety
	<i>Provide physical, manual, or skilled labor:</i> Perform services such as painting, cleaning, etc.
	<i>Repair/Service:</i> Fix mechanical things, restore machinery to functional operation
	<i>Transport:</i> Move materials or people from one location to another in vehicle or by physical strength
	<i>Work with animals:</i> Raise, tend, train, or treat domestic or wild animals
	<i>Work with plants:</i> Perform activities related to planting and maintaining lawns and other plants

SECTION 2: Analytical Ministries

Section 2 consists of activities that are of an analytical nature, such as those that involve exploring and examining physical, scientific, and cultural things to understand and control them. Sample servant opportunities: writing computer programs; setting up or maintaining Websites for the church; tutoring youth in science, math, computers.

Analytical Ministries	
	<i>Analyze/Evaluate:</i> Appraise, critique, assess, examine, study, judge
	<i>Categorize/Classify:</i> Sort, arrange, order or label concepts, things, etc.
	<i>Check for Quality:</i> Inspect objects or places for compliance with specific standards
	<i>Estimate:</i> Determine the approximate value/cost of something or materials required for a project
	<i>Perform tests:</i> Check and measure the performance, quantity, or quality of equipment, machines, food, substance, processes, programs, people, etc
	<i>Solve problems/Troubleshoot:</i> Generate and implement solutions to resolve difficulties
	<i>Research/Compile data:</i> Systematic discovery using investigation, observation, or written resources
	<i>Use math formulas:</i> Use statistical or mathematical formulas to make calculations with data
	<i>Write computer programs:</i> Develop computer programs or use computer languages

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SECTION 3: Creative Arts Ministries

Section 3 consists of activities that involve the use of physical, verbal or human material to create art forms or products. Sample servant opportunities: using drama or music in worship or evangelism; writing press releases, articles, curriculum for the church; using arts and crafts as outreach events.

Creative Arts Ministries	
	<i>Compose music:</i> Write original music or variations of musical compositions
	<i>Cook/Prepare food:</i> Prepare, cook, bake or arrange food or meals with regard for nutrition and visual appeal
	<i>Design/Create:</i> Artistically plan or form a work of art, decorative scheme, program, etc.
	<i>Edit:</i> Revise or rewrite written materials to improve content or style
	<i>Entertain/Perform:</i> Act, sing, dance, play a musical instrument, speak, etc., for an audience
	<i>Illustrate/Portray images:</i> Sketch, draw, paint, photograph, videotape
	<i>Improve/Modify:</i> Change or adapt in order to enhance, refine, make better
	<i>Make artistic handicrafts:</i> Create decorative or useful items that are visually appealing
	<i>Synthesize:</i> Integrate diverse parts into a new whole
	<i>Translate/Interpret:</i> Explain ideas and concepts so that they are more easily understood (usually involves foreign language or sign language)
	<i>Write:</i> Express ideas, facts, and information in articles, books, advertisements, etc.; may be creative, informative, or technical material

SECTION 4: Interpersonal Ministries

Section 4 consists of activities that involve interaction with other people for their enjoyment or to inform, train, develop, cure, educate or otherwise assist them. Sample servant opportunities: teaching classes at church or in the community; hosting a Bible Study; serving in the Prayer/Crisis ministry; facilitating small group or social activities.

Interpersonal Ministries	
	<i>Advise/Counsel:</i> Give information, suggestions and recommendations; urge adopting a course of action
	<i>Diagnose:</i> Determine causes of physical, emotional or spiritual problems
	<i>Encourage/Motivate:</i> Inspire, stimulate, and strengthen others; instill courage, spirit or confidence
	<i>Host/Offer hospitality:</i> Welcome people to a place or event; make them feel comfortable
	<i>Listen:</i> Pay thoughtful, careful attention to both information and feelings expressed by a person
	<i>Mentor/Coach:</i> Instruct, advise, support people to assist their personal/professional development
	<i>Prescribe treatment:</i> Recommend course of action to help physical/emotional/spiritual problems
	<i>Provide medical care:</i> Administer first aid, treat, nurse, rehabilitate, heal, cure, etc.
	<i>Provide personal services:</i> Guide people to locations; serve food or beverages; take care of skin, hair, nails, etc.
	<i>Refer to resources:</i> Direct people to useful information, places, people, etc.
	<i>Teach/Train/Speak:</i> Present, explain, clarify, or summarize information; speak before or facilitate groups

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SECTION 5: Leadership/Organizational Ministries

Section 5 consists of activities that involve persuading or influencing others, typically within a business context. Sample servant opportunities: developing publicity materials for the church; fundraising; leadership on a church team.

Leadership/Organizational Ministries	
	<i>Influence/Persuade:</i> Stimulate others to take action or change an opinion or belief
	<i>Manage money:</i> Strategize for use of money; prepare budgets, plan investments, etc.
	<i>Mediate/Act as a liaison:</i> Serve as intermediary between two or more parties (may be for purpose of resolving conflict)
	<i>Negotiate:</i> Deal or bargain to gain settlement or agreement
	<i>Plan:</i> Devise a strategy for accomplishing an objective
	<i>Purchase/Buy:</i> Obtain goods and services through exchange of money or other payment
	<i>Represent:</i> Take the place of a person, group, or organization; speak and make arrangement on behalf of the other party
	<i>Sell/Promote:</i> Convince someone of the value of a product, service, idea or concept
	<i>Supervise/Manage:</i> Oversee carrying out of work assignments by others

SECTION 6: Administrative Ministries

Section 6 consists of activities that involve precise, ordered use of data, keeping records, calculating, managing an office, organizing numerical and written data, and working with finances. Sample servant opportunities: taking minutes for team meetings; organizing church activities and events; helping others organize their homes or finances; keeping financial records for the church, etc.

Administrative Ministries	
	<i>Attend to details:</i> Pay attention to small items, parts, or elements with carefulness and thoroughness
	<i>Calculate/Compute:</i> Determine by mathematical methods or reasoning
	<i>Coordinate/Make arrangements:</i> Schedule, coordinate, handle logistical details for people or events
	<i>Manage records:</i> Collect, classify, or record information; update records as needed
	<i>Organize:</i> Categorize, systematize details, papers, physical things, work flow, etc.
	<i>Type/Enter data on a computer:</i> Use manual dexterity to input data using a keyboard
	<i>Verify accuracy:</i> Check written materials, financial records, or other data for errors
	<i>Work with financial data:</i> Prepare, audit, balance financial information, etc.


